Welcome to sx^wda^2dab (pronounced "swh-dah-dub")! This place is one of the many traditional and ancestral lands of the Nisqually Tribe or $s\dot{q}^wali^2ab\check{s}$ (Squally-absh), who are still active stewards of the area today.

Their traditional lands spread as far as you can see, and all the way up towards Mt. Rainier, or təqwu?ma? (pronounced "tuh-quo-ma"). They had camps from the mountain to the sea, following the seasonal rounds of berries, game, salmon, and seafood.

sx^wda?dəb means "a place to gather your spirit powers" and was named for the village that used to stand at this very spot! Now this place is the home of the tribe's Culture Center, as well as the tribe's Traditional Food & Medicine Garden, where dozens of native plant species are grown.



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




